It is our prayer that everyone who reads this letter may know the Lord, or will accept Jesus as their Lord and Savior.

We are just home from Michigan from our EBM Enrichment Conference. Now we are busy packing, paying bills that will come due while we are gone and finalizing many details before we leave again.

We have our tickets to leave June 21 for Bucharest Romania, then take a 12 hour train to Ukraine - We will have staff tanning then two weeks of camp, preach in churches, and meet with nationals and maybe a little manual labor also. Pray that our connections will go well and that we will be able to get all the 350 shirts, 250 Hot Wheels, plus other supplies across the Ukrainian/Romanian border without any problems. Also pray for the staff and Pavel, our camp director. We will do staff training first, then camp in two different villages somewhere in northwestern Ukraine. Pray also for the children that will be attending. 90% of these children are from unbelievers homes and have never heard about God's love in sending His only Son to die for the sins of his people.

Continue to pray for the children that attended camp in the past 6 years. In one of the villages where we had camp last year, they started Sunday school and there are 11 children that are still attending. Here is a picture of that camp.
